Having received information by a finall vessel I captured yesterday from Ancona, that his Majesty's late stoop Bull Dog was lying in the Mole of that port ready for sea, with supplies on board for the French army in Egypt; I judged it necessary to make an attempt to take or detroy her with the boars of the Mercury; and as our success depended upon surprising the enemy, who was ignorant of The gailant conduct of the officers and men employed upon furprifing the enemy, who was ignorant of our arrival in the Admiral to, (the fortifications about the Mole being too formidable to juffify the attempt in any other way), I therefore made fall directly for Ancona, and came to an anchor foon after it was dark, off the Mole. The boars were accordingly prepared, and I ft the flip at half paff ten o'clock, under the command of Mr W. Mather.
