Alleyne Baron St Helen's of that part of the United Kingdom called Ireland, his Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Court of St Peterburgh, and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style, and title of Baron St Helen's, of St Helen's in the Isle of Wight, and county of Southampton.
