The Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and Principal Secretary of State, &c., &c., &c.

IN virtue of the powers contained in the Prisons (Scotland) Administration Act, 1860 (23 and 24 Vict., cap. 105, sec. 27), I do hereby order and intimate that the Prison of Maxwelltown, in the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright, shall on and after the 1st day of January next, cease to be a legal Prison.

Given under my hand and seal at Whitehall, the 19th day of November 1874, in the 38th year of Her Majesty's reign.
