Copy of a Letter from the Honourable WILLIAM CORN-WALLIS, Admiral of the Blue, &c. to EVAN NEPEAN, Efg. Jated off Ushant, 31st August 1801.

HAVE the pleasure of transmitting to you, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter from Captain Martin, of his Majesty's ship Fisgard, by which it appears the boats of that ship, the Diamond and Boadicea, have cut out of Corunna a ship of twenty guns, and other veffels.

Lieutenant Pipon, who commanded the boats feems to have conducted the enterprise with much gallantry and judgment; for although exposed to a heavy fire from the batteries, yet the success was accomplished without any loss; and the conduct of the officers and men who were with him merits my warmest approbation.

Fifgard, off Ferro!,

SIR, Aug. 21. 1801.

I beg to inform you, that last night the boats of his Majesty's ships Fifgard, Diamond, and Boadicea attacked the vessels of the enemy lying in the harbour of Corunna, and succeeded in bringing out El Neptuna, a new ship, pierced for twenty guns, belonging to his Catholic Majesty, a gun-boat mounting a long thirty-two pounder, and a merchant ship, who were moor-ed within the strong batteries that protest the port, and so near them that the fentinels on the ramparts challenged our people, and immediately commenced a heavy fire, but the prizes were towed out with a degree of coolness and perfeverance that does infinite credit to the officers and men, and can only be equalled by their conduct throughout the affair. I should be very glad, if it were in my power, to do justice to refrence.
