The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competition for Clerkships (Class I.), in the Civil Service, will be held in London, on Tuesday the 6th of June 1876, and following days, under the Special Regulations, dated 28th March 1873, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

Preliminary Examinations will be held in London, Edinburgh, and Dublin, on Tuesday the 9th of May, and on Tuesday the 23d of May.
