The Queen has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal granting the dignity of a Baronet of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland unto Sir Richard Temple, of the Nash, in the Parish of Kempsey, in the County of Worcester, K.C.S.I., Lieutenant-Governor of the Bengal Provinces of Fort William, and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten.
