THE Queen has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, appointing Sir Colin Blackburn, Knt., one of the Judges of the Queen's Bench Division of the High Court of Justice, to be a Lord of Appeal in Ordinary, under the provisions of 'The Appellate Jurisdiction Act, 1876,' and granting him the dignity of a Baron for life, by the style and title of Baron Blackburn, of Killearn, in the County of Stirling.
