PRISON OF GLASGOW.

The Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and Principal Secretary of State, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, of date the 22d day of December in the year 1876, a Secretary of State's Order was granted under the powers of 23 and 24 Vict., the Prisons (Scotland) Administration Act, altering the classes of Prisoners for whom the Prison of Glasgow is a legal Prison, in so far that no Prisoner, sentenced after the 4th day of January 1877 to a period of thirty days' imprisonment therein, should be detained for such thirty days, but every Prisoner so sentenced should, before the expiry of fifteen days from the date of such Prisoner's sentence, be removed to the Prison of Paisley: And whereas it has been represented that the state of accommodation in the two Prisons renders it desirable that no Female Prisoners under sentence should be removed from the Prison of Glasgow to the Prison of Paisley, after the time when this Order comes into effect.

In virtue of the powers contained in the Prisons (Scotland) Administration Act, 1860, I hereby order and intimate that the said Order, in so far as the same may be held to include Prisoners of the Female Sex, is altered by this Order, so that on and after the day when this Order comes into effect,

no Female Prisoner shall be removed, in terms of the said Order of date the 22d day of December 1876, from the Prison of Glasgow to the Prison of Paisley. Further, that this Order shall come into effect on the 24th day of January 1877.
