This day the Lords being met, a message was fent to the Honourable the House of Commons, by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Uflier of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that "The Lords, authorised by virtue of his Majesty's commission for declaring his royal affent to several acts agreed upon by both Houses, to defire the immediate attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;" and the Commons being come thither, the faid commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to
