A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS our Parliament stands prorogued to the thirtieth day of October instant: We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Proclamation be further prorogued to Wednesday the nineteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this twentythird day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the forty-first year of Our reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN.

At the Court at Balmoral, the 23d day of October 1877.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

It is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Thurs-

day the twentieth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven; and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

Declaration between Great Britain and the United States for the Protection of Trade Marks.

Ireland, and the Government of the United States of America, with a view to the reciprocal protection of the marks of manufacture and trade in the two countries, have agreed as follows :-

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as belong to native subjects or citizens, or as are now granted or may hereafter be granted to the subjects and citizens of the most favoured nation, in everything relating to property in trade marks and trade labels.
