HER Majesty in Council was this day pleased, on a representation of the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education, to appoint George Gardner, Esquire, B.A., late Junior Student of Christ Church, Oxford, to be one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools.

Whereas by section 18 of 'The Extradition Act, 1870,' it is among other things enacted,

that if by any law made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the surrender of Fugitive Criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, either—

Suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Act, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such Foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer;—

Or direct that such law or ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act :

And whereas by an Ordinance enacted by the Legislature of Ceylon, the short title of which is, 'The Extradition Ordinance (Ceylon), 1877,' it is provided that 'all powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace in relation to the surrender of Fugitive Criminals in the United Kingdom under "The Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873," are thereby vested in and may in the Colony be exercised and done by any Police Magistrate in relation to the surrender of Fugitive Criminals under the said Acts.'

And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that the said Ordinance shall not come into operation until Her Majesty shall, by Order in Council, direct that the said Ordinance shall

have effect within the Colony as if it were part of 'The Extradition Act, 1870,' but that the said Ordinance shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been publicly made known in the Colony.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of 'The Extradition Act, 1870,' and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, direct that the said Ordinance shall have effect in the Colony of Ceylon, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of 'The Extradition Act, 1870.'

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Carnarvon, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

'ACTS TO REGULATE AND AMEND THE LAW
'RESPECTING

'THE SALMON FISHERIES OF SCOTLAND.'

District of the River FLEET (Sutherlandshire).

WHEREAS, by a Bye Law which took effect from 11th March 1865, the Annual Close Time for the District of the River Fleet (Sutherlandshire) is declared to be from 27th August to 10th February, with extension of time for Rod Fishing from 27th August to 31st October; and whereas a Petition has been presented by His Grace the Duke of Sutherland, to me, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in terms of the 9th section of 'The Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868,' praying for an alteration of the present Annual Close Time; and whereas, after having directed inquiry to be made in the District of the said River Fleet, in terms of the above-mentioned 9th section of 'The Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868,' I am satisfied that the Annual Close Time applicable to the said District should be varied; therefore I, the said Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, by the present Order given under my hand, in virtue of the powers conferred on me by the above-mentioned 9th section of 'The Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868,' do hereby order and direct that the Annual Close Time applicable to the District of the said River Fleet shall be varied and altered, so that it shall commence on the 10th day of September and terminate on the 24th day of February, both days inclusive, and that it shall be lawful to fish for and take Salmon with the Rod and Line from the 10th day of September to the 31st day of October, both days inclusive.

(Additional Borrowing Powers; Amendment of Act.)
