SIR. I beg leave to inclose, for their Lordships' information, the copy of a letter to my 'and keith, giing an account of an action and capture of a Spa-

ving an account of an action and capture of a Spanish privateer ship by his Majesty's ship under my command; and have the honour of being, Sir, &c.

'We' Woold Ridgest's His Majesty's Armed Brig My Lord, Pasley, Gibrahar.

I have the honour of informing you, that, in execution of your orders, on Wednesday the 28th inst. Cape de Gat bearing W. N. W. 20 leagues, I sell in with a polacea ship, who immediately gave chance, and, from her being to windward, we very soon neared each other, and commenced the action, which continued for an hour, when, finding her which continued for an hour, when, finding her guns much too heavy, and the gaffs, most of the flays and main rigging flot away, the only alterna-tive was to lay her on board, which was done by running across her hawse, and lashing her bowsprit to the capstern. The contest now became severe; but, from the intrepidity of the Pasley's ship's com-pany, notwithstanding the very great superiority of numbers on board the enemy, she was carried in about a quarter of an hour, and proved the Spanish ship privateer El Virgine del Resario, pierced for Inip privateer El Virgine del Kelario, pierced for 20 gins, but only 10 mounted, viz. two long 24-pounders, and eight long twelves, with a complement of 94 men, belonging to Malaga, on a cruize, out 20 days, but had taken nothing.


