And whereas the Board of Trade have represented to Her Majesty that the following Apothecaries Measures of Capacity, which have been constructed and duly verified and authenticated in the Standards Department of the Board of Trade, and their capacity actually determined in relation to the Imperial Standard Measure of Capacity, established under the provisions of section 6 of the Act 5 George IV. cap. 74, should be declared to be legal Secondary Standards of Capacity, in pursuance of sections 6 and 8 of 'The Standards of Weights, Measures, and Coinage Act, 1866,' viz. :-
