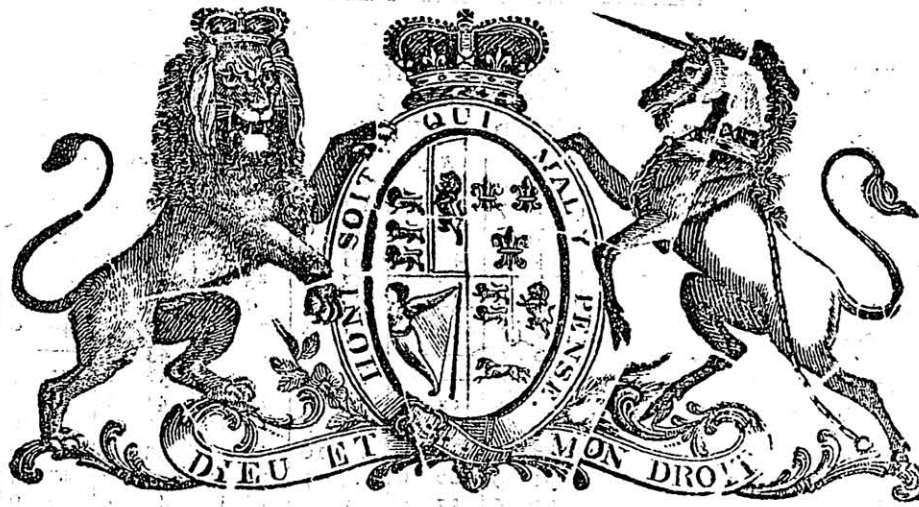

TO THE CREDITORS ON

THE sequestrated estate of *JOHN TOUGH*,
Seedman in Aberdeen.

At a general meeting, held at Aberdeen, on 29th ult.
John Warson, advocate in Aberdeen, was elected trustee,
and his appointment has been confirmed.

Upon application of the trustee, the Sheriff Depute of
Aberdeenshire has fixed Wednesday the 27th curt. and
Wednesday the 10th February next, both at 12 o'clock
noon, within the Sheriff Court-house there, for the pub-
lic examination of the bankrupt, on the state of his af-
