TO THE CREDITORS OF DANIEL M'LEOD, Grocer in Leith.— Robert Wilson, merchant in Leith, being elected trustee on the sequestrated estate of the said Daniel M'Leod, his appointment has since been confirmed by the Court of Session; and upon his application, the Sheriff of Edinburgh has appointed Thursday the 4th, and Thursday the 18th days of February next, at 11 o'clock forenoon, for the public examination of the bankrupt, and others concerned in his affairs, within the Sheriff Clerk's Office in Edinburgh.
