CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION, October 11, 1878.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for situations as Assistant of Excise in the Inland Revenue Department, will be held on Thursday and Friday the 19th and 20th of December 1878, in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Liverpool, Bristol, Plymouth, Leeds, Birmingham, Norwich, Glasgow, Dundee, Aberdeen, Cork, Galway, Belfast, Omagh, and Limerick, under the Regulations, dated 26th April 1875, and published in the London Gazette of the 30th April 1875.

Appointments will be given to the first 60 Candidates on the list, if duly qualified in respect of age, health, and character.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 5th of December, an 'application' on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from him at once.
