**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, as follows:—

The following is hereby approved as the qualification of a veterinary practitioner (not being a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, or, in Scotland, not holding the Veterinary Certificate of the Highland and Agricultural Society of Scotland), to be a Veterinary Inspector of a Local Authority in Great Britain, namely,—that he shall have been employed by that Local Authority as an Inspector or Veterinary Adviser under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869.

The Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable

Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

2. Cattle affected with pleuro-pneumonia may be moved out of places infected with pleuro-pneumonia, within the Burgh of Glasgow, for slaughter, in manner and under the conditions following, and not otherwise:

- (1.) The diseased cattle shall be moved, with a licence of the Local Authority of the Burgh of Glasgow, to a slaughter-house in the Burgh specified in the licence, in a float or cattle-van properly constructed so as to prevent contact of the diseased cattle with other cattle during the movement.
- (2.) The diseased cattle shall be moved to the slaughter-house in charge of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority; and the same officer shall enforce and superintend the immediate slaughter there of the cattle, and shall forthwith report the fact of the slaughter to the Local Authority.
- (3.) The float or cattle-van shall, immediately after each occasion of use, be cleansed and disinfected, by or under the superintendence of the Local Authority, in manner provided respecting vans by Article 8 of The Cleansing and Disinfection Order of 1878.
