A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Friday the nineteenth day of December instant: We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Thursday the fifth day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty: and we do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Thursday the fifth day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty, assemble and be holden for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thursday the fifth day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this fifteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and in the forty-third year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN.

At the Court at Windsor, the 15th day of December 1879.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

It is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Friday the sixth day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty; and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.
