The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Surgeon-General Thomas Longmore, C.B., Her Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of an Officer of the Order of the Legion of Honour, conferred upon him by the President of the French Republic, as a promotion from the Fifth Class of that

Order which he received in 1856 when Surgeon of the 19th Regiment, for his services in the Crimean War.
