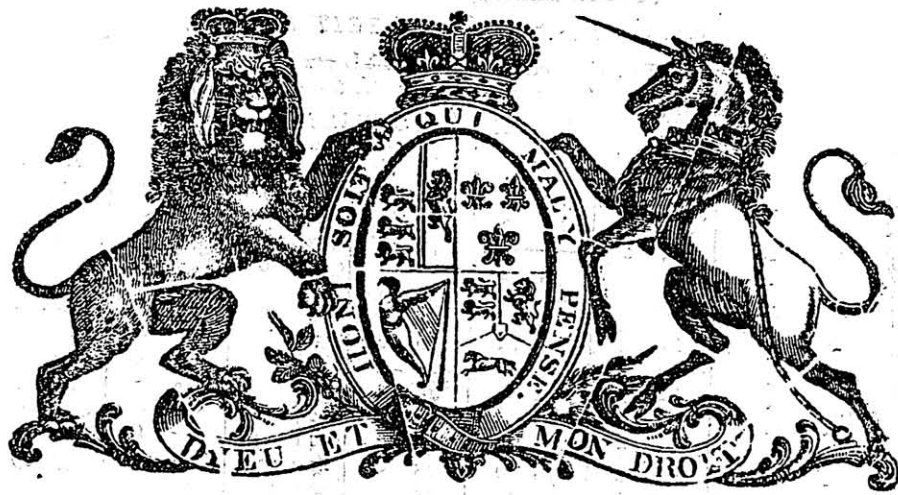

Pitt, Knight of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath and General of his Majesty's forces, (brother of the said George Lord Rivers) and to the heirs-male of his body lawfully begotten; and to the issue male of Peter Beckford, of Stapleton, in the county of Dorset; Esq; by Louisa Beckford, his late wife, deceased, (daughter of the said George Lord Rivers,) and to the heirs-male of their respective bodies lawfully begotten.
