Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 22d of March 1880, in the words following, viz.:—

March 1880, in the words following, viz.:—
'Whereas we are of opinion that it is expedient to make certain changes in the provisions for the award of Good Service Pensions contained in Articles 1982 to 1986 of the Regulations for the Government of your Majesty's Naval Service, with a view of rendering the award of such pensions more equitable, we would humbly submit to your Majesty the following proposals, viz.:—

'(1.) That we be empowered to confer the Flag Officers' Good Service Pensions of £300 a year on Officers whether on the Active or the Retired List, provided in the case of Retired Officers that retirement has taken place after attaining Flag rank, and that the retired pay together with the Good Service Pension shall not exceed the half-pay of an Admiral of the Fleet.

'(2.) That article 1986, paragraphs 1 and 2, viz.:

"1. Should any Flag Officer holding a Good Service Pension be in receipt of or be appointed to Full Pay (not including service on Committees or any temporary employment of a like nature) or Civil Salary, or become entitled to a Civil
