GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE CHURCH OF SCOTLAND, 1880.

OTICE is hereby given that Her Majesty's High Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, will hold a Levee at Her Majesty's Palace of Holyrood House, at eleven o'clock A.M., on Thursday the 20th day of May, being the first day of Meeting of the General Assembly, when all those holding Her Majesty's Commission are expected to appear in uniform or full dress.

After the Levee His Grace will proceed in State to the High Church, by the Calton Hill. Carriages of Noblemen and Gentlemen attending the Levee of His Grace the Lord High Commissioner will follow those of His Grace.

Noblemen and Gentlemen attending the Levee of His Grace are requested to bring with them two cards, bearing their name and address in fullone of which cards is to be left with an attendant appointed to receive the same at the entrance, the other to be given to the Usher in the Throne Room.
