in Schedule B hereto annexed:

And whereas it has been made to appear that
the alterations and additions contained in the last-
mentioned Schedule are reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the
power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with
the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to alter
and add to the fees heretofore taken by the In-
spectors of the Local Authorities for the counties,
boroughs, and burghs named in Schedule A
hereto annexed in the manner set forth in Schedule
B hereto annexed; and the fees specified in the
last-mentioned schedule shall be taken accordingly

in lieu of the fees specified in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act.

VACCINATION ACT.

PARISH OF TOROSAY, ARGYLL.

NOTICE is hereby given that in terms of the 12th Clause of the Vaccination (Scotland) Act, 1863,—26 and 27 Vict. cap. 108,—and upon application by the Parochial Board of Torosay, in the County of Argyll, the Board of Supervision have framed a Modification of the 8th Clause of the said Act, as hereinafter expressed, to supersede the provisions in that Clause so far as regards the said Parish of Torosay, and that the said Modification has been approved of by the Lord Advocate in conformity with the Act:—

‘In the 8th Clause of the said Act, where the word “Six” occurs, the word “Twelve” to be substituted for it.’

Accordingly, the 8th Clause of the Vaccination (Scotland) Act, 1863, will stand as follows, so far as regards the Parish of Torosay:—

‘The Father of every Child born in Scotland after the First Day of January in the Year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the event of the Death, Illness, or Inability of the Father, then the Mother, or in the event of the Death, Illness, Absence, or Inability of the Father and Mother, then the Person who shall have the Care, Nurture, or Custody of such Child, shall, within Twelve Months after the Birth of such Child, cause such Child to be Vaccinated by a Medical Practitioner, and upon and immediately after the successful Vaccination of such Child, the Medical Practitioner who shall have performed the Operation shall deliver to the Father or Mother of such Child, or to the Person who shall have the Care, Nurture, or Custody of such Child, a Certificate under his Hand, according to the Form of the Schedule (A) hereto annexed, that such Child has been successfully Vaccinated; and such Certificate shall, within Three Days after the Date thereof, be transmitted to and lodged with the Registrar for the District by the Father, Mother, or Person aforesaid; and such Certificate, if registered, shall, without further Proof, be admissible as Evidence of the successful Vaccination of such Child in any Information or Complaint which shall be brought against the Father, Mother, or Person aforesaid, for Non-compliance with the Provisions of this Act.’
