By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The Orders of Council described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.
- 2. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Orders, or either of them, before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Orders, or either of them.

SCHEDULE.

Order of Council of 13th May 1879 defining a part of the Port of Cardiff, in the County of Glamorgan, as a foreign animals wharf.

Order of Council of 27th October 1879 defining a part of the Port of Glasgow, in the County of Lanark, as a foreign animals wharf. (PORT OF GLASGOW.)

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 1st day October 1880.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

The Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Glasgow, in the County of Lanark, as a foreign animals wharf:—

All that space in the Port and Burgh of Glasgow, being part of the wharf and depôt of the Trustees of the Clyde Navigation, known as Yorkhill Wharf, situate on the south-east side of the road leading from Pointhouse to Partick, called the Ferry Road, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the south-east side of the said Ferry Road where the same is intersected by the water edge of the said wharf, thence passing in a south-easterly direction for a distance of three hundred and thirty-seven feet six inches or thereabouts along the coping which forms the water edge of the said wharf, thence running north-east on a line at right angles to the said coping for a distance of one hundred and seventy-five feet or thereabouts, bounded by a wooden fence, to a point on the south side of the Pointhouse Road, thence two hundred and seventy-two feet or thereabouts
