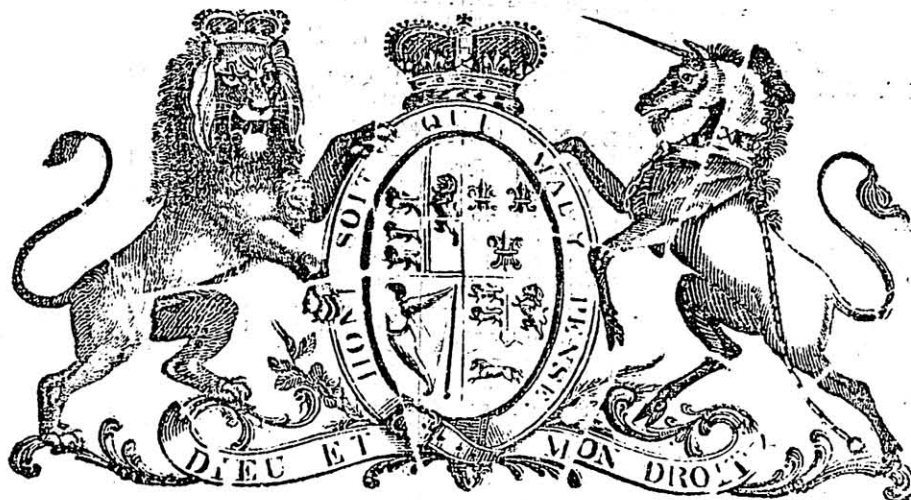

HIS MAJESTY'S COMMISSIONERS for Managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That, by a clause in an Act of the present session of Parliament, it is enacted, for the relief of all persons who have omitted to pay the several Rates and Duties, or any part thereof, upon Monies given, paid, or contracted for, with Clerks, Apprentices, or Servants, and also who have omitted to insert, and write in words at length in Indentures, and other writings relating to the service of any Clerk, Apprentice, or Servant, the full sum or sums of money, or any part thereof, received or contracted for, with or in relation to every such Clerk, Apprentice, or Servant, THAT, upon payment of *Double the Rates and Duties* upon the Monies, or such part of the Monies, so omitted or neglected to be paid, and also so omitted to be inserted and written in such Indenture or Writing, on or before the 24th day of December next, to the proper Officer, and tendering the same to be stamped at this Office, every such Indenture or other Writing shall be good and valid, and the persons so offending be excused from any penalty incurred by the omission thereof; except those against whom any prosecution shall be now depending.

LANDS IN STIRLINGSHIRE.
To be Sold, under the authority of the Act of Parliament for Redemption of the Land Tax, on Wednesday the 28 day of June 1802, within the Royal Exchange Coffeehouse, Edinburgh, at 2 o'clock afternoon,
THE Lands of CRAIGENDS, lying in the parish of Campsie, consisting of about 60 acres, presently possessed by Peter Stewart, upon a lease which he is bound to renounce to a purchaser upon payment of a stipulated sum.
