CRARAE PIER, IN THE PARISH OF KILMICHAEL GLASSARY AND COUNTY OF ARGYLL.

PROVISIONAL ORDER.

Power to Levy Tolls and Rates; Borrow Money; Regulate Vessels and Traffic; Constitute a Harbour Authority; and other Purposes.

Intended to be made to the Board of Trade, pursuant to the provisions of the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, and the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, Amendment Act, on or before the 23d day of December next, by General Robert Wardlaw, C.B., of Brecon House, Sherborne, in the County of Dorset; the Right Hon. William Ulick Tristram St. Lawrence, Earl of Howth, of Howth Castle, in the County of Dublin; Gilbert Metcalfe Robertson, of No. 54 Cadogan Place, in the County of Middlesex, Esquire; and Sir Archibald Spencer Lindsay Campbell, Bart., of No. 23 Moray Place, Edinburgh (who, together with their heirs, assigns, and successors, are hereinafter called 'the Promoters'), for a Provisional Order for all or some of the powers and purposes following, that is to say:

To authorize the Promoters to levy tolls, rates, duties, wharfage, and charges on vessels and boats, and on passengers, animals, fish, goods, vehicles, and matters and things at or in respect of the existing Pier known as Crarae (otherwise Cumlodden) Pier, situate in the Parish of Kilmichael Glassary and County of Argyll, and the warehouses, sheds, cranes, and other conveniences connected therewith, and for the supply of water to vessels, and to make provision for the collection and regulation of the same, and to confer, vary, and extinguish exemptions from such tolls, rates, duties, wharfage, and charges, and to make composition with respect to the payment thereof.

To authorize the Promoters to borrow money for the purposes of the said Pier or other works, and of the said Provisional Order, upon the security of the Pier and works, and the lands and property connected therewith, and of the tolls, rates, duties, wharfage, and charges authorized to be levied by the said Provisional Order, or on the security of such other works, land, property, tolls, rates, duties, wharfage, and charges, in combination, or of some of them.

To provide for the maintenance, management, and administration of the said Pier and works, and all matters relating thereto.

To authorize the Promoters to let on lease the said Pier and works, and the said tolls, rates, duties, wharfage, and charges, or any of them.

To make, alter, and rescind bye-laws and regulations for the management, use, and protection of the said Pier and works, and for the regulation and control of vessels, persons, and traffic frequenting or resorting to, or employed, embarked, disembarked, loaded, or unloaded at or near the said Pier or works, and to impose and recover penalties for the breach or non-observance of such bye-laws, rules, and regulations, and to appoint and remove pier-masters, meters, weighers, and other officers and servants.

To define the limits within which the powers of such pier-masters, meters, weighers, officers, and servants may be exercised.

To constitute the Promoters a harbour authority and pilotage authority for the said Pier, and the neighbourhood thereof, and to fix the limits of such authority.

To confer on the Promoters all powers, rights, and privileges necessary for carrying the said. Provisional Order into effect, and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which might interfere therewith.
