**VICTORIA**, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India.

Whereas it has been represented to Us, that it is expedient to extend the period during which the system may be continued of granting Brevet Promotion by succession on the occasion of a vacancy on the Establishment of General Officers of Our Indian Forces:

Our will and pleasure is that Clause (d) of Article 1, and Clause (d) of Article 2 of Our Warrant of the 28th January 1878, be cancelled, and that the following be substituted in lieu thereof:—

For Clause (d) of Article 1, relating to promotion of Captains to the rank of Major—

(d) By Brevet, in succession to a vacancy on the establishment of General Officers, provided such vacancy occur before the 1st October 1881.

For Clause (d) of Article 2, relating to the promotion of Majors to the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel—

(d) By Brevet, in succession to a vacancy on the establishment of General Officers, provided such vacancy occur before the 1st October 1881, or thereafter for so long as there remain any Majors on the List of Cavalry and Infantry who are not subject to the conditions prescribed in the General Order of Our Governor-General of India in Council, dated the 9th December 1859, No. 1637.

Given at Our Court at Osborne, this twenty-first day of December in the year

of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and in the forty-fourth year of Our reign.
