THE Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the 'Albert Medal of the Second Class' on—

Surgeon HENRY GRIER, Army Medical Department.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the 26th of August 1880, Lieutenant Graham, 10th Regiment, was dying of diphtheria, when Surgeon Green performed upon him the operation of tracheotomy; and, observing that no attempt at inspiration followed, applied his lips without a moment's hesitation to the wound, and, by suction, at the imminent risk of his own life, restored to the patient the power of breathing. Lieutenant Graham's life was thus saved for the time, although, unfortunately, on the following day the disease extended to his lungs, and he died.
