ROYAL WARRANT.

VICTORIA, by the grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India.

Whereas it has been represented to Us that it is expedient to relax the conditions for appointment to the Indian Staff Corps in the case of certain Officers of Our Royal Marines who have recently been appointed Probationers for the said Corps.

Our will and pleasure is, that the said Officers of Our Royal Marines shall be admitted to the Staff Corps without completing the period of probation ordinarily required, but that they shall be liable to removal from Our service provided they do not, within such time as Our Secretary of State for India in Council may fix, pass such tests and comply with such other conditions as he may adopt for governing the final admission of Officers who have been appointed on probation.

Given at Our Court at Osborne, this seventeenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fourth year of Our reign.
