HIGH COURT OF JUSTICIARY.

Glasgow on Monday, 25th April next, at eleven o'clock, instead of Tuesday the 26th, as formerly announced.

At the Court at Windsor, the 2d day of March 1881.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th of January 1881, in the words following, viz.:—

'Whereas your Majesty was graciously pleased by an Order in Council dated 10th November 1866, under the authority of the Naval Savings Banks Act, 1866, to established Naval Savings Banks on board your Majesty's Ships, and at the Head Quarters of the Divisions of Royal Marinés.

'And whereas we are of opinion that it would be expedient and for the benefit of Seamen of the Royal Navy to establish in addition thereto similar Banks in such of your Majesty's Naval Establishment on shore, as we may deem necessary, for the receipt of deposits from Seamen eligible to be

depositors in Naval Savings Banks, subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

'1. That the Interest to be allowed to Depositors in such Banks be fixed at the rate of £2, 10s. 0d. per cent. per annum for every complete pound deposited;

'2. That deposits be received in such Banks either by allotments or remittances from pay, or by cash personally tendered, from Depositors borne on the books of any of your Majesty's Ships and Vessels either at home or abroad.

'3. That the management of such Banks be vested in the Cashiers under the general supervision of the Superintendents of such Establishments.

'We do therefore beg leave to recommend that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to direct by your Order in Council, under the authority of the Act before quoted, that we may be empowered to open Savings Banks at such of your Majesty's Naval Establishments on Shore as we may think desirable, and further be authorized to issue from time to time such detailed Regulations for carrying the same into effect as we may deem necessary.

'The Lords Commissioners of your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence herein.'

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
