SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations, issued 8th April 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Clerk in the Solicitor's Office of the Treasury, Post Office, Inland Revenue and Customs Departments, and in the Office of the Examiner of Criminal Law Accounts.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. No candidate will be eligible whose age on the first day of the Examination is less than 20 or more than 30.

II. No candidate will be eligible who has not within the last five years had at least three years' experience as a Solicitor, or as an Articled Clerk in a Solicitor's Office. For the Solicitor's Office of the General Post Office, Dublin, no candidate will be eligible to compete who has not been, or is not qualified to be, admitted to practice as a Solicitor in Ireland; and no candidate will be eligible for appointment until he has actually been so admitted.

III. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :-

SECTIONAL ALTERATIONS.

OTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be forthwith made to Parliament by Petition for additional provision to authorize the following alterations in the section of the railway proposed to be authorized by the North British Railway (New Tay Viaduct) Bill, now pending in the House of Commons (copies of which section were deposited in the month of November last with the Principal Sheriff Clerks for the Counties of Fife and Forfar respectively, as stated in the said Bill), and therein called Railway No. 2, that is to say :

1.
