William Ulick Tristram, Earl of Howth, in that part of the said United Kingdom called Ireland, by the name, style, and title of Baron Howth, of Howth, in the County of Dublin.

Donald James, Baron Reay, in that part of the said United Kingdom called Scotland, by the name, style, and title of Baron Reay, of Durness, in the County of Sutherland.

Sir Harcourt Vanden Bempde-Johnstone, Bart., by the name, style, and title of Baron Derwent, of Hackness, in the North Riding of the County of York.

Sir Henry James Tafton, Bart., by the name, style, and title of Baron Hothfield, of Hothfield, in the County of Kent.

Sir Dudley Coutts Marjoribanks, Bart., by the name, style, and title of Baron Tweedmouth, of Edington, in the County of Berwick.
