THE Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the 'Albert Medal of the Second Class' on—

WILLIAM HENRY BURT, of Devizes.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

At two o'clock on the afternoon of the 15th July last, a fire broke out on the premises of Mr. Ernest Wellings, Italian Warehouseman, Market Place, Devizes. After the fire had been raging some time, and all the inmates of the house had effected their escape, it was reported that there was a certain quantity of gunpowder stored in the shop, and Mr. BURT at once volunteered to enter the burning premises and remove the case containing the gunpowder. At this time a great body of flame was distinctly visible on the other side of the shop counter only a few feet distant from the spot where the gunpowder was deposited.

It was under these circumstances that Mr. BURT made his way into the shop, effecting his entrance through the window; and eventually succeeded in finding and removing the box containing ten or twelve pounds of gunpowder, thereby preventing an explosion, which might have been attended with serious loss of life amongst those necessarily engaged in dealing with the fire, as well as amongst the crowd of onlookers.

The Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross upon the undermentioned Officers and Soldier, whose claims have been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for their gallant conduct in Afghanistan, as recorded against their names:—

Regiment.	Names.	Acts of Courage for which recommended.
Bengal Staff Corps	Captain (now Brevet-Major) William John Vousden	For the exceptional gallantry displayed by him on the 14th December 1879, on the Koh Asmai Heights, near Kabul, in charging, with a small party, into the centre of the line of the retreating Kohistani force, by whom they were greatly outnumbered, and who did their utmost to close round them. After rapidly charging through and through the enemy, backwards and forwards, several times, they swept off round the opposite side of the village and joined the rest of the Troop.
Bengal Staff Corps	Captain (now Major) Arthur George Hammond	For conspicuous coolness and gallantry at the action on the Asmai Heights, near Kabul, on the 14th December 1879, in defending the top of the hill with a rifle and fixed bayonet, against large numbers of the enemy, while the 72d Highlanders and Guides were retiring; and again, on the retreat down the hill, in stopping to assist in carrying away a wounded Sepoy, the enemy being not sixty yards off, firing heavily all the time.
The Gordon Highlanders	Lieutenant William Henry Dick Cunyngham	For the conspicuous gallantry and coolness displayed by him on the 13th December 1879, at the attack on the Sherpur Pass, in Afghanistan, in having exposed himself to the full fire of the enemy, and by his example and encouragement rallied the men who, having been beaten back, were at the moment wavering at the top of the hill.
Seaforth Highlanders (Ross-shire Buffs)	Lance - Corporal Sellar George	For conspicuous gallantry displayed by him at the assault on the Asmai Heights, round Kabul, on the 14th December 1879, in having in a marked manner led the attack, under a heavy fire, and, dashing on in front of the party up the slope, engaged in a desperate conflict with an Afghan who sprang out to meet him. In this encounter Lance-Corporal Sellar was severely wounded.
