A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to the twelfth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one: We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Saturday the seventeenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this twenty-fifth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fifth year of Our reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN.

At the Court at Balmoral, the 25th day of October 1881.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

It is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Pro-

vinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued, to Monday the nineteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.
