Thirty-eight Shillings and Eight Pence
Per Hundred Weight,

Exclusive of the Duties and Customs paid or payable thereon, on the IMPORTATION thereof into GREAT BRITAIN, which by the authority of Parliament, is directed to be deemed and taken as the Average Price of BROWN or MUSCOVADO SUGAR, for the purpose of regulating the Allowance of the DRAWBACK on the Exportation of Sugar of the British Plantations; and the Payment of the Bounty on the Exportation of REFINED SUGAR, produced from Muscovado Sugar imported from his Majesty's Plantations in America.
