INTIMATION is hereby given, in terms of an Interlocutor by the Lords of Council and Session, Commissioners for the Plantation of Kirks and Valuation of Teinds, dated 3d July 1882, and pursuant to the Statute 7th and 8th Victoria, cap. 44, that a Petition has been presented to their Lordships for and in name of DAVID BALLANTYNE of Sunnybrae, in the Parish of Innerleithen, and Others, Contributors to the Endowment of the Church and proposed new Parish *quoad sacra* of Walkerburn, situated within the Parish of Innerleithen and Presbytery of Peebles, praying their Lordships, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Acts of Parliament therein recited, to Decern and Erect the Church at Walkerburn into a PARISH CHURCH in connection with the Church of Scotland, and to Mark out and Designate the District specially set forth in the said Petition, consisting of a portion of the said Parish of Innerleithen and a portion of the Parish of Traquair, or such other District as their Lordships shall see fit, as the District to be attached *quoad sacra* to the said Church; and to Disjoin said District *quoad sacra* from the Parishes of Innerleithen and Traquair, to which the same now belongs; and to Erect the said Church and District into a Parish Church and Parish *quoad sacra* in connection with the Church of Scotland, to be called THE CHURCH AND PARISH OF WALKERBURN; and to Find and Declare that the Minister and Elders of the said Church and Parish so to be erected shall have and enjoy the status, and all the powers, rights, and privileges of a Parish Minister and Elders of the Church of Scotland; and to Find and Declare that, upon Walkerburn Church aforesaid and District to be attached thereto being erected into a Parish Church and Parish *quoad sacra*, in terms of the foregoing cravings, the election and appointment of the Minister thereto shall be thereafter made in accordance with the provisions of the Act 37 and 38 Victoria, cap. 82; but always under reservation of the right of the Presbytery of the bounds to present to the said Church *jure devoluto*, according to law, and as provided in the said Act of the 7th and 8th Victoria, cap. 44; and to Find, Decern, and Declare in the premises, in terms of the foregoing cravings, or in such other terms as to their Lordships shall seem meet, as the said Petition in itself more fully bears; And Intimation is hereby further given that, agreeably

to the appointment contained in said Interlocutor, the Petitioners have lodged printed copies of the said Petition with the Session Clerks of the Parishes of Innerleithen and Traquair, and with the Minister of Walkerburn Church, for the use of such parties interested as may apply for the same.
