Horatio Viscount and Baron Nelson of the Nile, and of Burgham Thorpe, in the County of Norfolk, Knight of the most honourable military order of the Bath, and Vice-Admiral of the blue Squadron of his Majesty's fleet, (also Duke of Bronte in Sicily, and Grand-Croix of the order of St Ferdinand and of Merit) his royal licence and permission to receive and wear the insignia of the order of the Crescent, which the Grand Signior hath transmitted to him: And also, to command, that this his Majesty's concession and declaration together with the relative documents, be registered in his College of Arms.
