'Acts to Regulate and Amend the Law respecting 'The Salmon Fisheries of Scotland.'

We, the Commissioners appointed under the said Acts, and empowered thereby 'to fix and define 'for the purposes of this (the first recited) Act, 'and the other Acts relating to Salmon and Salmon 'Fisheries in Scotland, the natural limits which 'divide each River in Scotland (including the 'Estuary thereof) from the Sea, in so far as the 'same may not be already fixed by Statute or 'judicial decision,' do hereby fix and define the limits which divide the River flowing from the Loch of Stenness under the Bridge of Waithe, including the Estuary thereof, from the Sea to be a straight line drawn from Houton Head to the Ness on the west side of Stromness Harbour; as

regards the Kirbuster Water and Grameshall Burn, a straight line drawn from Houton Head to Roseness; as regards the Water from Tankerness Loch, a straight line drawn from Moul Head to Rerwick, and from Rerwick to the Head of Work; as regards the water from Wasdale Loch, a straight line drawn from the Ness to the north of the Bay of Isbister to Carness; as regards the Burn flowing into the Bay of Woodwick, a straight line drawn from Scarataing on the north to Midgarth on the south; as regards the Burn at Aikerness, a straight line drawn west-north-west from Aikerness Point till it meets the mainland; as regards the River flowing from the Loch of Boardhouse, a straight line drawn from the outermost point of the Brough of Birsay to Marwick Head; as regards the Lyrwall and Mill Bay Burns (Island of Hoy), a straight line drawn from Heckness to Green Head; as regards the Burn falling into Hoy Sound near Linkness, a straight line from Bow to Bring; as regards Rackwick Burn, a straight line from Roray Head to Snuck Head; as regards Sauren Water (Island of Rousay), a straight line from the south-east point of the Peninsula of Stockness to a point on the coast of Rousay where the Egilshay Peat Road runs down to the Sea; as regards the Saviskail Burn, a straight line from the South Gio of Saviskail Head to a point on the coast of Rousay where the Saviskail Road runs down to the Sea; as regards the Streams running into Pierowall Bay (Island of Westray), a straight line drawn from Breckaskail to Cleat; as regards Elwick Burn (Island of Shapinsay), a straight line from Balfour Castle to Hacossness; and as regards Strathore Burn, a straight line from Galtness to Gioness.

'The Salmon Fisheries of Scotland.'

District of the Rivers of Waithe, Kirbuster,  
Grameshall, Boardhouse, Swannay, &c.

We, the Commissioners appointed under the said Acts, and empowered thereby 'to determine, subject to the provisions of this (the first recited) Act, at what dates the Annual Close Time for every District shall commence and terminate, and at what periods subsequent to the commencement and prior to the termination of the Annual Close Time it shall be lawful to fish for and take Salmon

'with the Rod and Line,' do hereby determine that the Annual Close Time for the District of the Rivers Waithe, Kirbuster, Grameshall, Boardhouse, Swannay, and for the other Rivers, Waters, Lochs, Burns, and Sea Coasts of the Orkney Islands, shall commence on the 10th day of September, and terminate on the 24th day of February, both days inclusive, and that it shall be lawful to fish for and take Salmon with the Rod and Line from the 10th day of September to the 31st day of October, both days inclusive.

'Acts to Regulate and Amend the Law respecting  
'The Salmon Fisheries of Scotland.'

Fishery District of the Orkney Islands.

We, the Commissioners appointed under the said Acts, and empowered thereby 'to make general regulations with regard to the due observance of the Weekly Close Time,' do hereby make the following regulations with regard to the due observance of the Weekly Close Time in the said District, namely:—

- (1.) That in each and every Stake Weir or Stake Net a clear opening of at least four feet in width from top to bottom shall be made and kept free from obstruction in each and every Pouch, Trap, or Chamber of the same.
- (2.) That the Pouches, Traps, or Chambers of each and every Fly Net shall be either raised and tied up to the upper ropes of the same, or lowered and tied to the lower ropes, so as effectually to prevent the capture or obstruction of Salmon.
- (3.) That the Netting of the Leader of each and every Bag Net shall be entirely removed and taken out of the water.

'The Salmon Fisheries of Scotland.'

Fishery District of the Orkney Islands.

We, the Commissioners appointed under the said Acts, and empowered thereby 'to make general regulations with respect to the Meshes of Nets' to be used for the capture of Salmon, do hereby make the following regulations with respect to the Meshes of Nets for the Fishery District of the Orkney Islands:—

That no Net shall be used for the capture of Salmon the Meshes whereof shall be under one inch and three-quarters in extension from knot to knot, measured on each side of the square, or seven inches measured round each Mesh when wet; and the placing two or more Nets behind or near to each other in such manner as to practically diminish the Mesh of the Nets used, or the covering the Nets used with Canvas, or the using any other artifice so as to evade the provisions of the Regulations with

respect to the Meshes of Nets, shall be deemed to be an act in contravention of this Bye-law.
