Monsieur Paul Gabriel Maden, an Officer in the Forest Department of the French Government, for services in connection with the administration of the Forest Department of Cyprus.

The Queen has been pleased to approve of Cavaliere Ferdinando de Goyzueta as Consul at Singapore, with jurisdiction over the Straits Settlements, for His Majesty the King of Italy.

The Queen has also been pleased to approve of Mr. William Simpson as Vice-Consul for Inverness, Nairn, Findhorn, Lossiemouth, Burghead, Portmahomack, Invergordon, Fort William, and Island of Skye, to reside at Inverness, for the German Empire.
