CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give

notice that on the 13th November 1882, and following days, a Competitive Examination will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Bristol, Leeds, Liverpool, Cork, and Belfast, under the Regulations issued 8th July 1881, and amended by notices in the London Gazette dated 11th July and 1st August 1882, at which examination 95 candidates will be selected for Men Clerkships of the Lower Division of the Civil Service (including those who may succeed in the limited competition under Clause 11 of the Order in Council of 12th February 1876).

A preliminary examination will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Bristol, Leeds, Liverpool, Cork, and Belfast, on Tuesday the 31st October 1882.

No person will be admitted to the preliminary examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 20th October, an 'application,' in the handwriting of the candidate, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary, at once.
