Father in God Dr Lewis Bagot, late Bishop thereof; and his Majesty has also been pleased, by his Royal Sign Manual, to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Rev. Father in God Samuel Horsley, now Bishop of Rochester, to be by them chosen Bishop of the said See of St Asaph.

The King has been pleased to grant to the Hon. Gerald Valerian Wellesley, Clerk, Master of Arts, the place and dignity of a Prebendary of the collegiate church of St Peter, Westminster, void by the death of the Rev. Dr Joseph Hoare.
