BY THE KING - A PROCLAMATION, For Diffolving this prefent Parliament, and doclaring the Calling of another.

Whereas we have thought fit, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, to diffolve this present Parliament, which now stands prorogued to Tuesday the seventeenth day of August next : We do, for that end, publish this our Royal proclamation; and do hereby dissolve the faid Parliament accordingly. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their meeting and attendance on Tuelday the seventeenth day of August next. And we being defirous and refolved, as foon as may be, to meet our people, and to have their advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all our loving subjects our royal will and pleafure to call a new Parliament; and do hereby further declare, that, with the advice of our Privy Council, we have given order, that our Chancellor of that part of our United Kingdom called Great Britain, and our Chancellor of Ireland do, respectively, upon notice thereof, forthwith iffue our writs in due form, and according to law, for calling a new Parliament: And we do hereby alfo, by this our Royal proclamation under our Great Seal of our United Kingdom, require writs forthwith to be iffued accordingly by our faid Chancellors respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Com-

to be duly returned to and give their attendance in our said Parliament; which writs are to be returnable on Tuesday the thirty-first day of August next.

BY THE KING - A PROCLAMATION. In order to the Eleaing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland.

GEORGE R.

Whereas we have, in our Council, thought fit, to declare our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland on Tuesday the thirtyfirst day of August next ensuing the date hereof: In order, therefore, to the electing and fummoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parllament, we do, by the advice of our Privy Council, iffue forth our Royal proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to afsemble and meet at Holyrood House, in Edinburgh, on Tuesday the tenth day of August next enfuing, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and chuse the Sixteen Peers, to fit and vote in the House of Peers, in the faid ensuing Parliament, by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such mons, who are to ferve in our faid Parliament, I as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers, and I

producing a mandate in writing duly figned be\_ fore witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law). And the Lord Clerk Register or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session, as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such election made, and duly examined, to certify the names of the Sixteen Peers fo elected, and fign and attell the same, in the presence of the said Peers the Electors; and return such certificate into our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And we do, by this our proclamation, ffrictly command and require the Provost of Edinburgh, and all the other Magillrares of the faid, to take especial care to preferve the peace thereof during the time of the faid election; and to prevent all manner of riots, tumults, diforders, and violence whatfoever. And we strictly charge and command, that this our Royal procla nation be duly published at the market cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, twenty-five days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the faid Peers to proceed to fuch election.

Witness Ourself at Windsor the ninth day of June one thousand hundred and two, in the forty year of our reign.
