NAPLES, June 9.

Charles Emanuel the Fourth, King of Sardi-nia, having by an inflrument, dated at Rome the 4th of this month, refigned his Crown and dominions in favour of his brother the Duke de Aolt, his Royal Highness has acceded to the Crown, under the name of Victor Emanuel.

Paris, June 17.

The Ottoman Minister at this residence has this day received from Constantinople the act of accession, on the part of the Sublime Porte, to the definitive treaty of peace between his Ma-jelly and the French Republic, the King of Spain, the Batavian Rapublic, figned at Amiens on the 27th of March latt.

Downing-Street, June 29.

Accounts have been received here, that his Majetty's ratification of his acceptance of the King of Sweden's act of accellion to the Convention, figued at St Petersburgh the 17th of June 1801, had reached Stockholm.

A disparch has been received from his Excellency Lord St Helen's, his Majesty's Ambaffador Extraordinary at the Court of St Petersburgh, dated June 3, containing the particulars of what passed between the Count de Kotlchoubey and Baron Stadingk, the King of Sweden's Ambaffador at St Peterfburgh, on the occasion of the latter's acceding, in the name of his Swedish Majesty, to the Convention between his Majesty and the Emperor of Rossia, figned at St Petersburgh the 17th of June 1801.
This diff atch slates, "That he, (the Count),

after endeavouring to refute the various objections that had been urged by the Baron de Stedingk against the senor of the Convention of the 17th June 1801, and to demonstrate to him that that treaty prefented to the Northern Powers all the advantages that it had been found possible to chain, had proceeded to obterve, that the antecedent Convention between Ruffia and Sweden having been in some fort broken by that which had fince been concluded between Russia and England, and to which Denmark had also acceded, it would certainly be advisable for Sweden to accede likewife to that treaty, in order that fine might not remain in a manner infulated, and that some common pact might still continue to exist between the powers of the North."

The King has been pleafed to appoint William Fullarion, Efq.; Brigadier-General Thos. Picton, and Samuel Flood, Esq. Captain of the Royal Navy, to be his Mojesty's Commissioners for executing the office of Governor and Com mander in Chief in and over his Majetty's Island of Trinicad.
