CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION,

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Out-door Officer in Her Majesty's Customs will be held under the Special Regulations, dated 23d June 1882, and published in the London Gazette of the same date, on Friday the 1st June 1883, in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Liverpool, Bristol, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Hull, Leeds, Portsmouth, Plymouth, Swansea, Glasgow, Aberdeen, Cork, Belfast, and Limerick.

Appointments will be given to the first 40 candidates on the list, if duly qualified in respect of age, health, physical qualifications, and character.
