WHITEHALL.—July 15. 1802.

THE King has been pleased to give and grant unto the Right Honourable Horatio Viscount and Baron Nelson of the Nile, and of Burnham Thorpe, in the county of Norfolk, Knight of the Most Honourable order of the Bath, and Vice-Admiral of the Blue Squadron of his Majesty's fleet, (also Duke of Bronté in Sicily, Grand Cross of the order of St Ferdinand and of Merit, and Knight of the order of the Crescent), his royal licence and permission to receive and wear the ensigns of Knight Grand Commander of the Equivarian Sular, and Capitular Order of Saint Joachim; his Lordship's nomination to the same having been signified to him by Ferdinand Charles reigning Count of Leiningen Welferbourg, Grand Master of the Order, by his letter bearing date at Welferbourg in General Chapter, on the 3d day of April last:

And also to command, that this his Majesty's concession and declaration, together with the relative documents, be registered in his College of Arms.
