CHARLES ADAM, merchant in Dundee, being elected trustee on the said William Sturrock's sequestrated estate, at a general meeting held on the 13th July curt. and his nomination confirmed by the Court of Session, hereby intimates to all concerned, That the Sheriff of Forfar-shire has fixed Friday the 15th of August next, and Thursday the 2d day of September following, at 12 o'clock noon, for the public examination of the bankrupt, in the Sheriff-clerk's Office, Forfar; and on Friday the 3d day of September next, a general meeting of the creditors will be held in the house of William Gordon, vintner in Dundee, at 12 o'clock noon, for the purpose of instructing the trustee as to the management and recovery of the bankrupt's estate.
