Scheme, under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, for the Administration of the Endowment known as the Hutton Trust, in the Parish of Caerlaverock and County of Dumfries, hitherto held and administered under Deed of Mortification by John Hutton, Doctor of Medicine, dated 14th September 1708, and recorded in the Books of Council and Session 14th February 1719.

Preamble.

1 and 2. Future Administration, Transference

of Property.

3. Constitution and Election of Governing Body. The governing body, hereinafter called the governors, shall consist of seven persons, of whom

One shall be elected by the Minister and Kirk-Session of the Parish of Caerlaverock. One shall be elected by the School Board of the Parish of Caerlaverock.

One shall be elected by the Parochial Board of the Parish of Caerlaverock.

One shall be appointed by the Lord Lieutenant of the County of Dumfries, hereinafter called the Lord Lieutenant.

One shall be appointed by the Sheriff of the County of Dumfries, hereinafter called the Sheriff.

One shall be elected by the Town Council of Dumfries, and

One shall be elected by the School Board of the Burgh of Dumfries.

The governors electe: by the Minister and Kirk-Session, by the School Board of Caerlaverock, by the Town Council of Dumfries, and by the Burgh School Board of Dumfries, shall, in the case of the first election, hold office for a period of five years, and thereafter until the first day of August after the expiry of that period. The governors elected by the Parochial Board of Caerlaverock and appointed by the Lord Lieutenant and the Sheriff shall, in the case of the first election, hold office for a period of three years, and thereafter until the first day of August after the expiry of that period. The governors shall, in the case of all elections or appointments subsequent to the first, hold office for a period of five years from and after the expiry of the term of office of their predecessors, except as hereinafter provided. Each election shall be made at a meeting convened and conducted according to the ordinary rules and practice of the electing body. The governors may be elected by the several electing bodies either out of their own number or otherwise. Any governor may be re-elected or re-appointed. The first governors shall be elected or appointed as soon as conveniently may be after the date of this Scheme. The clerk or other officer of the governors shall, at least one month before the expiry of the term of office of any governor, give notice to the proper electing body, or to the Lord Lieutenant or the Sheriff, as the case may be, and the electing body, or the Lord Lieutenant or Sheriff, shall, as soon as conveniently may be after such notice, appoint or elect a governor to hold office from the expiry of said term. Any election or appointment not made as aforesaid within three months from the date of this Scheme, or from the date of the notice of expiry of a term of office or from the date of the notice of a vacancy, as hereinafter prescribed, shall, in that case, be made by the then existing governors.

Application of Income.

23. Application of Income. — The governors,

after paying the necessary expenses of management, and the burdens and taxes affecting the Endowment, shall apply the free income of the Endowment in the manner hereinafter provided.

24. Annual Payment for Non-Educational Purposes.—The governors shall apply one-third of the free annual income of the Endowment to the purposes, other than educational, set forth in the said Deed of Mortification by the said Dr. John

25. Annual Payment to the School Board of the Parish of Caerlaverock.—The governors shall pay the annual sum of £200 to the School Board

of Caerlaverock, on condition-

(1) That the School Board shall apply the same in providing a sufficient salary to the head teacher of the school in the parish of Caerlaverock, known as Hutton Hall, who shall in the case of any appointment after the date of this Scheme be a graduate of some university in the United Kingdom, and by supplying such assistance as may enable him to devote his attention chiefly to the upper standards, and to the teaching of specific subjects.

(2) That the School Board shall apply to the purposes of the said school the annual sum of not less than £50 out of the rates, and the whole fees and Government

grant earned in the said school.

(3) That the School Board give free education in the said school to not more than twelve scholars who have passed the fifth standard, and who shall be selected by the governors by competitive examination under the conditions and regulations of the twenty-eighth section hereof, from scholars attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Caerlaverock. The free education thus given shall be continued for a period not exceeding three years, and shall be held to include any of the specific subjects taught in the school.

The governors shall satisfy themselves from time to time that the said annual payment is applied under the conditions contained herein for the promotion of higher instruction; and, if it appears to them that the said annual payment is not so applied, they shall withdraw the same, provided always that, if the said School Board object thereto, the consent of the Scotch Education Department shall be obtained before the withdrawal of the said annual payment.

26. Application of Annual Payment to School Board in event of Withdrawal.—In the event of the School Board declining to accept the said annual payment under the conditions of the immediately preceding section, or in the event of its being at any time withdrawn under the provisions thereof, the governors shall apply the said annual payment to the purposes of the thirty-

second section hereof.

27. Free Scholarships.—The governors shall apply the sum of £40 yearly in paying, in whole or in part as they may think fit, the fees of scholars, with books and stationery, at public or State-aided schools in the parish of Caerlaverock, for elementary education as defined in the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882. The free scholars shall be children whose parents or guardians, not being in receipt of parochial relief, are in such

elementary education, and are persons who, in the opinion of the governors, ought not to be required to apply to the Parochial Board for such aid.

In the case of children under ten years of age, the selection of free scholars shall be made with due regard to merit as ascertained by such examination, suited to the age of the candidates, as the governors may from time to time prescribe; or in the case of children for whom such examination is unsuitable, by evidence that the children possess such qualifications as to justify their selection; and in the case of children who have been in attendance at school during one or more school years, the governors shall, in making their selection, give special weight to good conduct, attendance, and progress at school during the previous year. The fees, in respect of children under ten years of age shall not be paid for more than one school year without reappointment, and the amount to be expended in paying fees for such children shall not exceed one-third of the amount to be applied under this section.

In the case of children of ten years of age and upwards, the free scholars shall be selected by competitive examinations, which shall be open to all of the same age who are eligible in terms hereof, whether they have or have not previously been beneficiaries; and for such children the school fees may continue to be paid for such period not exceeding three years as the governors may determine. If any scholar gain a school bursary his school fees shall no longer be paid under this

section.

The governors, at the end of every school year, shall obtain from the teacher or teachers a special report as to the conduct, regularity of attendance, and progress of all scholars whose school fees are paid in whole or in part under this section, and the fees of no scholar shall continue to be paid in regard to whom such report is not satisfactory

The governors may, if they see fit, intrust the carrying out of the provisions of this clause to a committee appointed by them, partly from their own number, and partly from the members of the

School Board of Caerlaverock.

28. School Bursaries.—The governors shall apply the annual sum of £60 in establishing school bursaries, to be called the Hutton School Bursaries, each of the yearly value of not less than £5 nor more than £10. These bursaries shall be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Caerlaverock, who have passed the fifth standard of the present Scotch Code, or such standard as may from time to time be fixed by the Scotch Education Department pursuant to the Education (Scotland) Acts, as that entitling children to total exemption from the obligation to attend school, and whose parents are in such circumstances as to require aid for giving their education; higher these bursaries shall be tenable for two years at public or Stateaided schools in which efficient instruction is given in the higher branches.

29. Apprentice Allowances. — The governors may, if they think fit, allow any child who has been successful in the competition for the bursaries established by the immediately preceding section, after holding the bursary for one year at a public or State-aided school, in which efficient instruction is given in the higher branches, and after passing the sixth standard, to take in lieu of the second year of the said bursary an allowance not exceeding circumstances as to require aid for providing one-half of the amount fixed by the governors as or handicraft, and shall attend evening classes or other course of instruction to be approved by the governors; but not more than £20 annually of the sum applied under the immediately preceding section shall be expended in such allowances. The governors shall obtain a report as to the character and efficiency of the instruction given, and of the attendance and progress of the holder of the

30. University or Technical School Bursaries. -The governors shall establish a bursary for university or technical education, which shall be called the Hutton University Bursary, of the yearly value of £30. This bursary shall be awarded by competitive examination among those who have been pupils in public or State-aided schools in the parish of Caerlaverock for at least a year before the date of examination, or who have obtained one of the bursaries established by the twenty-eighth or thirty-first sections hereof; the bursary shall be tenable for such period not exceeding three years, as the governors may determine, at a university or technical school to be approved by the governors.

31. Bursaries for Higher Education .- The governors shall apply the annual sum of £30 in establishing bursaries for higher education or technical instruction, to be called the Hutton Bursaries, each of the yearly value of not less than £10 nor more than £15. These bursaries shall be awarded by competitive examination among pupils attending public or State-aided schools in the parish of Caerlaverock, whose age at the date of competition shall not exceed fourteen years, and shall be tenable for such period not exceeding three years as the governors may determine, at the Dumfries Academy or such other schools for higher education or technical instruction as the governors may ap-

32. Application of Surplus Revenue -The governors shall pay over the surplus revenue to the Governors of the Dumfries Educational Trust,' constituted under Scheme by the Commissioners under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, subject to the conditions and provisions of said Scheme.

33-34. Forfeiture and Annual Distribution of Bursaries.

35. Residue of Income.—The residue of the free annual income, in so far as it has not been applied under the provisions of this Scheme, shall be invested by the governors as soon as it shall amount to £200, and form part of the capital fund of the Endowment.

VACCINATION ACT.

PARISH OF GLENISLA, FORFAR.

OTICE is hereby given that in terms of the 12th Clause of the Vaccination (Scotland) Act, 1863-26 and 27 Vict. cap. 108,-and upon application by the Parochial Board of Glenisla, in the County of Forfar, the Board of Supervision have framed a Modification of the 8th Clause of the said Act, as hereinafter expressed, to

the annual value of the said bursary, on condition supersede the provisions in that Clause so far as that he or she shall be apprenticed to some trade regards the said Parish of Glenisla, and that the regards the said Parish of Glenisla, and that the said Modification has been approved of by the Lord Advocate in conformity with the Act:-

'In the 8th Clause of the said Act, where the word "Six" occurs, the word "Nine" to be substituted for it.'

Accordingly, the 8th Clause of the Vaccination (Scotland) Act, 1863, will stand as follows, so far as regards the Parish of Glenisla:-

'The Father of every Child born in Scotland after the First day of January in the Year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the event of the Death, Illness, or Inability of the Father, then the Mother, or in the event of the Death, Illness, Absence, or Inability of the Father, then the Mother, or in the event of the Death, Illness, Absence, or Inability of the Father and Mother, then the Person who shall have the Care, Nurture, or Custody of such Child, shall, within Nine Months after the Birth of such Child, cause such Child to be Vaccinated by a Medical Practitioner, and upon and immediately after the successful Vaccination of such Child, the Medical Practitioner who shall have performed the Operation shall deliver to the Father or Mother of such Child, or to the Person who shall have the Care, Nurture, or Custody of such Child, a Certificate under his Hand, according to the Form of the Schedule (A) hereto annexed, that such Child has been successfully Vaccinated; and such Certificate shall, within Three Days after the Date thereof, be transmitted to and lodged with the Registrar for the District by the Father, Mother, or Person aforesaid, and such Certificate, if registered, shall, without further Proof, be admissible as Evidence of the successful Vaccination of such Child in any Information or Complaint which shall be brought against the Father, Mother, or Person aforesaid, for Non-compliance with the Provisions of this Act.'
