### LORD CHAMBERLAIN'S OFFICE, AUG. 27.

The Gentlemen to wear black full trimmed, fringed or plain linen, black swords and buckles.

Undress, grey frocks.

The Court to change the mourning on Sunday the 5th September next, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans, and tippers; or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed coloured swords and buckles.

And on Thursday the 9th of September the Court to go out of mourning.
