Henry John Montagu-Douglas-Scott, commonly called Lord Henry John Montagu-Douglas-Scott, by the name, style, and title of Baron Montagu, of Beaulieu, in the County of Southampton.

William Buller Fullerton, Baron Elphinstone in that part of the United Kingdom called Scotland, by the name, style, and title of Baron Elphinstone, of Elphinstone, in the County of Haddington.

Charles John, Baron Colville of Culross in that part of the United Kingdom called Scotland, Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, by the name, style, and title of Baron Colville of Culross, in the County of Perth.
