THE Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Henry Pottinger Keatinge, Esq., Surgeon-Major in the Egyptian Army, Her Majesty's Royal licence and permission that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Fourth Class of the Order of the Osmaieh, which His Highness the Khedive of Egypt, authorised by His Imperial Majesty the Sultan, has been pleased to confer upon him, in recognition of his services whilst actually and entirely employed beyond Her Majesty's Dominions in the Egyptian Army.
